Chris Lotito, Past State President and Convention Coordinator since 1992 will be honored at the Grand Council Banquet at the Double Tree Hotel in Torrance, California. Chris is being honored for the many years he acted as our convention coordinator. He is retiring from that position and this tribute is to thank him for all he has done for the Order.

Chris N. Lotito was born in Los Angeles, California. His parents, Carlo and Gioiella Lotito were from Canneto, a province of Puglia, Italy. He was raised within the Los Angeles area following family traditions taught by his parents, a heritage he relishes to this day. He has devoted much of his time to create a better image of his Italian ancestry.

Chris is married to Mary Gasparo and is blessed with three wonderful daughters, Jo Ella, Anna Lee and Carla Marie. five grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

He served his country in World War II in the navy and was trained at the San Diego Naval Hospital and received the rank of Pharmacist Mate Second Class. Out of a class of 600 he was the 10th highest with an A average. His tour of duty took him to the Norco Naval Hospital where he assisted in the operating room. He was stationed at Camp Shoemaker, Hawaii, Hong Kong, Sing Tao and on the USS Opleck, a naval destroyer.

Chris received his education at Loyola where he excelled academically and in sports playing football, baseball and basketball.

The team was a champion team and for two years Chris received gold footballs. He also attended John Muir Jr. College and was active in sports.

In 1953 Chris joined the Pugliese Lodge and has been a continuing member for 60 years. Because of his dedication to his Italian heritage he pursued his goals to serve in every capacity of the Order starting locally and reaching that of State President.

Prior to that he held the position of financial secretary of his lodge and then president for 11 years. He was president of the United Lodges, commission chair for the Athletic Committee. Ritual and Protocol Committee, bowling league president, golf club president,

National Trustee, National Foundation Trustee and many, many more titles from various organizations.

He has received recognition from the City of Los Angeles, California State Assembly, and California State Senate. He was the Grand Marshall in the Sons of Italy parade in San Diego and was honored by the Italian government with the title of Cavalieri.

Before his full retirement Chris was in the furniture and appliance business for 33 years. He may have retired from work but never retired from the Sons of Italy especially when it came to planning our conventions. He has always done a terrific job planing the events and we are all grateful.





Air Pressure

There is a difference between weight and mass. The weight of an object is the amount of pull of the earth's gravity. The weight of a body depends upon how near to the earth it is, while its mass remains the same anywhere, provided that nothing is taken away or added to it.

Air has mass and weight. It you weigh a bottle, you know its weight. If you pump the air out of the bottle and weight it again, the bottle will weigh less. The air in a bottle contributes to the weight of the bottle. For a one liter bottle, the difference amounts to more than a gram. When a mass of air moves rapidly we feel the weight of air.

Because air has weight it exerts pressure on anything immersed in it, including the human body. The reason we don't feel the pressure of air on our bodies is because there is an equal pressure from the cavities, fluids, and tissues inside our bodies. At the surface of the earth, air pressure is about 14.7 pounds per square inch. This is over a ton per square foot.

When the Duke of Tuscany was digging a well, he was baffled that no pump was able to raise the water more than 34 feet above the level of the well. The great Italian astronomer Galileo became interested in the problem and asked his friend and pupil Evangelista Torricelli (1608-1647) to conduct experiments.


Torricelli used a tube of mercury set in a dish of mer-

cury. The mercury in the tube descended creating a vacuum that was able to hold up a 30inch column of mercury. Torricelli concluded that the liquid in the tube was supported by the outside air pressure on the mercury in the open dish.

Some people took Torthe air pressure returned to normal.

Torricelli invented the instrument we know as the barometer. He also contributed to the development of integral calculus. On Galileo's death in 1642 Torricelli succeeded him as professor of philosophy and mathematics at the University of Pisa. The torr, a unit of measurement used by physicists working in nearvacuum conditions, is named after Torricelli.

Air pressure does not stay the same every day. Because barometers can measure air pressure, they are useful to weathermen. When the mercury in a barometer falls rapidly it indicates bad weather is ahead. Barometers, called altimeters, are useful to pilots because they tell pilots how high they are above sea level.





Is it NOW valid?? You

The first vote was at 2016 Convention. 83 delegates voted YES to sell it. 1 person voted **NO** to keep it. We thought that was pretty good, after all, there were only 153 delegates voting, and even if all the ones abstaining (69) changed their minds, it would still be a vote to sell.

Well, we received a ballot in the mail last month, and it's called an "opinion" vote. In it are 3 opinions to keep the building and 1 opinion to sell . This is what I call stacking the deck. There was supposed to be 1 for and 1 against, at least that's what we were told. And **ONE** of the opinions against selling it signed her name as being on the "Grand Lodge Building Sale Committee"—which wasn't even the right name—despite never attending the meetings, never doing any of the work, and being put on the committee AFTER all the information had been gathered and the report given. The ballot also had instructions, and apparently 11 delegates couldn't follow those instructions, (which I find very hard to believe), so those votes got tossed out. And now, they want us to believe that NOT ONLY did all the people who abstained at Convention have now all voted yes to sell the building, (and I DON'T believe it) but 26 delegates changed their minds (and votes)???? That is way too far fetched to believe. NOW the vote is called Extraordinary Vote and results (by a committee chosen by the State President) are: **57 YES** (sell) 72 No (keep), 11 Invalid and 27 abstain. As I read back on this, it looks a bit confusing, even to me, and I know what

I am writing! So I will try to make it a bit easier:

2016 Convention "Straw Vote" totals SELL:83 KEEP: $1 \text{ ABSTAIN:} 69 = 153 \ 2017$ "Opinion Vote" totals SELL:57 KEEP: 72 AB-STAIN:27 INVALID: 11 = **167** read as "Extraordinary vote" Differences 26 71 42 14 Is it ethical to have 14 more delegates vote than were there at the original vote? Is it ethical to allow a vote be cast by a non delegate? Is it ethical to insert 3 opinions against the sell vs 1 opinion for the keep, in the ballot packet? Judge for yourself.

I know for a fact, that 2 delegates have passed away, and 1 delegate did not get his ballot, but it was mailed to someone else. Did the delegates that voted to sell **CHANGE THEIR MINDS?** What would make someone change their minds, when asbestos, non-compliance for handicapped people, no parking, potentially dangerous area, no room for growth and no income opportunities are valid reasons to sell?(more on this later in the article) Can ONE Yes voter explain how or why they would change a vote? We have even heard of a party given and delegate schmoozing. I hope that is


