

Ernest Joseph Bertaina (Ernie) passed away on July 4, 2002, at his home with his loved ones by his side. Born in Hanford in 1928 to Barney and Rosie Bertaina, he attended kindergarten in a one-room schoolhouse (South School). He attended Jefferson Elementary, then graduated 8th grade from St.Rose Catholic school in 1943. He was a Hanford High graduate with the Class of 1947.

Ernie had so many jobs throughout his lifetime. He farmed with his family; drove a school bus for Hanford High School; worked for Bertram Motor Sales and Lakeside School; and was an Animal Control Officer for the County of Kings for 41 years. In his "spare time" Ernie was a Hanford Police Department Reserve Officer, a Deputy Constable and a Private Process Server.

To top it all off, we worked part-time for Whitehurst McNamara Funeral Service for over 50 years.

In 1950 Ernie became a member of Hanford Sons of Italy Lodge #1543. He was a member for 72 years at the time of his death. Along with his parents, Ernie helped bring the culture of Italy to his relatives and friends in America. He held several different offices throughout the years, helping at dinner-dances, spaghetti dinners and other fundraisers. CHARM BRACELETS

The story of jewelry goes back to the dawn of mankind. We have an instinct to adorn our bodies with beautiful items, but also with items to make us feel powerful, fortunate, and blessed. The use of primitive jewelry predates writing systems. Precious metals and colorful crystals were eagerly sought and treasured. Handmade jewelry was an early industry and a traded commodity. It is an indicator of wealth and social status, chiefly worn around the neck and arms. The Etruscans who lived in Italy before the Romans were famous for their works of gold. Fashions in various locations were established in jewelry as in clothing. Many examples of ancient jewelry can bee seen in museums today. Jewelry in one form or another will probably never go out of fashion.

Bracelets have been worn in almost ever culture. They have been worn by individuals of various ages and genders. They are worn on hands and feet. A hand bracelet is often designed to slip over the hand and be kept on the wrist without slipping off the hand so many bracelets have a locking hinge or are made of a flexible material to achieve this purpose.

In the twentieth century charm bracelets were fashionable. They gained popularity during World War II. They are still worn today. They are generally gold- or silver-toned. Some charms are made of colorful enamels. Some incorporate gemstones. Some are made of genuine gold or silver. Some are hand crafted. And some are vintage or antique. 


