Joe Bono's Restaurant became a local source of Italian foods previously unavailable in the area.

Bono's Restaurant and Deli is a historic restau-rant located at 15395 Foothill Boulevard in Fontana, California. The restaurant opened in 1936 to serve travelers on U.S. Route 66, which then passed in front of the site; it originally operated as a produce stand. In 1943, increased traffic on the high-way prompted the owners to expand their operations, and the current building was constructed as a full-service restaurant. Mama Bono was a figure head at the restaurant and greeted every customer as they walk in. The restaurant building has a Streamline Modern design and features red and green stripes promoting its Italian cuisine as well as painted grapevines promoting its wine. As Fontana's Italian immigrant community grew in the 1940s, the restau-rant also became a local source of Italian foods pre-viously unavailable in the area.

The Big Orange, a 7-foot tall orange-shaped cit-rus stand, is located on the property of the restaurant. The Orange Stand was originally located 3 miles to the east; restaurant owner Joe Bono purchased the stand in the 1990s and moved it to its current site. While the restaurant had an orange-shaped stand of its own when it served Route 66 traffic, it was eventually demolished due to decreased demand. The Big Orange is one of six surviving orange-shaped build-ings in California.

The restaurant, which is currently closed, was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2008. Joe Bono received permission to move the building 20 feet back from Foothill Boulevard in 2013. There are people who have lived in Fontana for many years and they know parts of this great town's history. There are a select few who have lived here for 80-plus years and have seen so much change. Some, like Joe Bono, are still working to keep the history alive.

Joe is a man who was born in Fontana in 1930. His parents settled here in the 1920s. Joe was born on Sierra Avenue in a doctor's office before any hospitals existed in this city. The only elemen-tary school that existed was located where City Hall stands today.

He went to Fontana Junior High School and once he got to high school, he attended Chaffey in Ontario because there wasn't a high school in Fontana yet. Once he graduated, he offered to drive the high school students in a school bus from Fontana over to Chaffey High in Ontario, California. He then went on to attend USC and graduated from USC Law School. He worked for the district attorney's office in San Bernardino for a number of years. In 1995, his mother passed away and he decided to return to the family business.

Joe's parents opened Bono's Deli and Restaurant in 1936. The family had originally moved here for the grapes. Back in those days, Fontana was filled with Vineyards. Joe's father and grandfather would har-vest the grapes. The first batch was sold and shipped back east. The second batch was sold to the local wineries. The Bono family members kept the third batch and made their own wine.

Joe's mother started selling orange juice from the historic orange stand that still sits to the right of Bono's Deli on Foothill Boulevard, close to Sultana Avenue.

The Bono family has deep roots in this city. Joe's parents built their home right behind their restaurant and they raised him and his three sisters there. All of them went on to college and had suc-cessful careers. Joe now lives in that home. The Bono fam-ily personally knew A.B. Miller, the founder of Fontana. Joe remembers a time when everyone knew each other and the sense of community and business was strong.

The history of their restaurant and the Orange Stand have people from all over the world coming to see what the Bono family created. Joe has been sent pic-tures from people who have visited the historic or-ange. He has been gracious in allowing tourists

to come into the restaurant. He tells them stories from the past and shows pictures of what once was. He has let-ters written in Italian from those who have traveled such a far distance to get a glimpse at history. If you Google this family and the orange stand, you will find many blog posts from visitors who have traveled along Route 66 to see its many attractions. The orange stand can be found on the Fontana Wikipedia page as well.

Bono's Deli is a place that many Fontana residents remember for its Italian sandwiches and pasta dishes. Mama Bono was a hardworking mother and busi-ness owner whose picture still hangs in the back room of the restaurant. Joe was very close to his mother and he keeps her memory alive in Bono's Deli.

The restaurant has been closed for several years now. The county as well as a company has built a warehouse across from the deli on Sultana. They moved the deli building about 20 feet back away from Foothill Boulevard to widen the street.

Joe has also been a part of the Fontana Historical Society for years. He has done his part to ensure that the history of this city remains. He has fond memories of Hazel Putnam, who led the Historical Society for many years.

He still has hopes that his historic restaurant will not be just a memory and that someday it will re-open again and the people of Fontana, and those who travel from all over, will be able to sit at the tables, eat the food and enjoy the place that his family members dedi-cated their lives to all those years ago. His restaurant has many nostalgic memorabilia of the 1940s and 1950s. It is safe to say that Joe Bono is a huge part of Fontana's history, and the legacy of his family will remain for years to come. Joe Bono is a charter member of the Joanne Coccia Lodge 2553. He joined the lodge in 1984.

Saturday -




