I trust that everyone had a blessed Easter with family and friends. For most Italian American families, our feasts emanate from the Roman Catholic Church. Of course, the two biggest feasts are Christmas and Easter, followed by the anniversaries of the Saints feast days. The most popular are Festa of San Giuseppe (Patron Saint of Sicily), Festa of San Gennaro (Patron Saint of Naples), Festa of San Marco (Patron Saint of Venice), Festa of San Francisco (Patron Saint of Calabria) and of course Mary Mother of Jesus Christ.

Our family's Easter celebration really started on Palm Sunday when we would go to Mass and get our blessed palms. Then we went to the cemetery to place some palms on all our family grave stones. I remember my Dad making the palms into small braided crosses for all the kids and larger ones for the tombstones. During the week leading up to Easter, we made Corona Pasqua (Easter Bread Wreath). It was a big braided bread with colored Easter eggs baked in the dough. Some were made in the shape of a wreath while others looked like breaded dolls with one egg at the top. They were always a hit with the kids. Traditionally Italian Americans went to church on Good Friday at noon and I remember the statues of the saints in our church having hoods over their heads. What I remember best is that Good Friday was the day we made Pizza Rustica. It was like a large quiche covered

in a bread crust. It measured about 12 inches long and 9 inches wide and 2 inches high. It was made of many different meats (boiled ham, soppressata, hard salami, prosciutto) and cheeses (ricotta, pecorino romano, provolone). I really enjoyed and still do the cutting up all the meats and cheeses and trying to sneak a few bits. Of course Good Friday was a Day of Fasting and No Meat so if we got caught by our Grandmother, mother or aunts or wives, we got a smack with the Cucchiaio (large wooden spoon) across our knuckles as penance. Holy Saturday was always and still is the day we eat our Pizza Rustica for

Easter Sunday was the day to dress up and start the day with Mass. After church we visited relatives houses and enjoyed a little snack of cookies or Easter Sweet Cake. When we got back home, the feast started. First course was celery and fennel with olive oil and seasonings and more Pizza Rustica or Pizza di Grano (sweet winter wheat pie). Second course was always Pasta usually Lasagna or Large Shells Stuffed with ricotta cheese. The third course of the meal was Roasted Leg of Lamb served with roasted potatoes, carrots and onions. As usual when Italian Americans end a holiday meal, it is always with a variety of desserts including Chocolate Easter Eggs, Sweet Easter Cake (Pastiera), cannolis, and several types of cookies... almond biscotti, amaretto cookies. All served with coffee, espresso and a shot of Lemoncello or Sambuco.

Alaska

On January 3, 1959, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the proclamation admitting Alaska as the forty-ninth state. He redesigned the American flag with seven rows of seven stars. The design needed to be changed again in March when he signed the bill admitting Hawaii as the fiftieth state. The flag was then finally designed with five rows of six stars and four rows of five stars. Members of the Order of Sons of Italy in America proudly recite the Pledge of Allegiance to this American flag and the republic of the United States of America.

In 1867 the United States bought Alaska from Russia for \$7,200,000. William H. Seward, who was then Secretary of State, made the purchase. Alaska is larger than the combined area of next three largest states: Texas, California, and Montana. It has many islands. The territory was so far away and so undeveloped that the American people thought he spent the money foolishly on "an icebox." They called Alaska "Seward's Folly." Later, Americans discovered more gold in Alaska than in the Yukon territory of Canada. Alaska has much wildlife, many forests and other natural resources, and much mineral wealth. It is important for our national defense.

On account of its cold climate, Alaska had very few people when it was purchased. It was too cold for cattle, but the government sent twelve hundred reindeer for use by the Eskimos. The herd increased rapidly, and

reindeer meat was shipped from Alaska to the United States for food. The value of salmon caught in Alaskan waters in 1929 was more than five times what the United States paid for the territory. "Seward's Folly" has proven to be one of the best buys ever made.

The people of Alaska elected their own legislature and sent representatives to Congress in Washington, but the President of the United States appointed their governor. In 1910 Alaska had about sixty-five thousand people, about half of them were whites and the rest Eskimos. All of them together would make the population of only one small city in America.

Sled dogs were an important a means of transportation in Alaska. Jack London (1876-1916) popularized sled dogs in his book Call of the Wild (1903). London had found the material that inspired his book from a trip to Alaska and Canada. He submitted his story to the San Francisco Bulletin, but the editor rejected it telling London that interested in Alaska had subsided.

The Alaska Agricultural and School of Mines, established in 1917, became the University of Alaska in 1935. Today Alaska is a composite of new and old. It has many fine cultural institutions. Alaska's capital is Juneau. Anchorage is its largest city. Alaska doesn't have a grand lodge of the Order Sons of Italy in America, but Italian Americans residing in Alaska may become national at-large members.



We all wish you a very happy Mother's Day.




