I'd like to thank President John Costa for canceling the Grand Council meeting and for doing a webinar instead. Brilliant decision!

We won't be able to celebrate Easter as we have in the past, but I thought you might like to read about some of the Easter traditions in Italy.

In Florence they celebrate La Festa del Carro. This tradition started in 1096, following the return of a Florentine knight, Pazzino di Ranieri de' Pazzi, who raised the Holy Cross banner in Jerusalem during the Crusades. For his bravery, he received pieces of flint from the Holy Sepulcher of Christ. Upon his return to Florence, these stones were used to light the Easter Vigil sacred fire and then ported around the streets of Florence. Today Florentines commemorate this event with a Sunday procession during which a 30-foot tall antique cart is pulled by a team of white oxen during a parade of 150 soldiers, musicians and other people dressed in 15th-century attire. The procession starts at Porta al Prato and ends in Piazza del Duomo in front of Santa Maria del Fiore. Once arrived, a dove-shaped rocket (La Colombina) holding an olive branch is shot towards a cart loaded with fireworks, setting off the scoppio (the boom). This yearly event is meant to bring a bountiful harvest, stable civic life, and growing business.

Rome is the city where the Vatican state resides, and

It is with deep sadness that I inform you of the passing of Past State President Joe Simile. Joe passed away peacefully on Sunday, March 15, 2020. Joe was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy.

Joe was born in Palermo, Italy and attended the Instituto Tecnico Commerciale, where he received a degree in accounting. He held a life-time teaching credential in the State of California, having taught the Italian Language.

He became a member of the Order in 1957, when he joined the Modesto Lodge #2021. His dedication to the Order was recognized in 1961 when he was elected Grand Trustee. He then went on to become the Assistant Grand Venerable, Grand Financial Secretary and then Grand Venerable in 1975 and 1977.

The Italian government recognized Joe's vast contribution to the Italian-American community of California and honored him with the title of Cavaliere I 1975 and with the title of Commendatore of the state of Arizona and was the National Co-Chair of the Douhet-Mitchell Committee for many years.

Joseph Simile is survived by his 4 children, Lela Seefeldt, Guy Simile, Maria Shaw and Joseph Simile, Jr. and many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

A private family service will take place this week. A Celebration of life will be scheduled, once the COVID-19 outbreak subsides.

who at this time of year is a mecca for Catholic pilgrims (do note that the Sistine Chapel does have exceptional closures during this long weekend celebration). Lucky for Roman visitors, however, all the other museums will stay open. On Good Friday many people gather in Saint Peter's Basilica to listen to the Pope's mass at 5 pm, and immediately following, the Pope starts his walk to remember the Christ's Via Crucis with a candlelit procession starting at the Palatine Hill. After making 14 stops along the way to remember the walk of Christ and pray, the holy pontiff ends at the Colosseum. The beauty of this procession also lies in the gathering of many pilgrims with torches that follow: even for those who do not consider themselves religious, this evening is magical.

Traditional Easter food is the second most important celebration during Pasqua. If you want to eat at a restaurant, you'll definitely want to first check if the place is open and second, make a reservation, noting that several restaurants do close from Good Friday till Pasquetta (the Monday after Easter). While dining in Rome, you won't want to miss the Roman traditional foods of Pizza Sbattuta, a sponge cake, hard boiled eggs, ham and corallina, a typical salami for Easter, as well as different varieties of salty cakes. You will also want to try the traditional lunch, consisting of oven-baked lamb, carciofi alla.

When the Arabs first brought dried pasta to Italy in the 13th century, it was served with honey and sugar, and eaten with the fingers, with the arm held high and the head tilted back. Another variation of it was simply for the pasta to be eaten plain. To mato sauce as an accompaniment to pasta did not come about until the 17th century and was revolutionary! Today, there are over 500 different types of pasta which are eaten throughout Italy. Northern Italy tends toward the white and creamy sauces, while the south prefers the red and meaty sauces. Sardinia prefers to call their sauce "ragu" (typically made with ground meat, onions, garlic, tomato puree, and red wine, and served with pasta), while others may say "sugo". One technique in Sardinia is to "kill the tomatoes", which means to sauté the tomatoes, garlic, and onions until they are almost dry.






