

We have lost many members this year and my heart goes out to everyone who will miss someone special this Holiday season.



Italy is a country rich in history. Therefore, it is no surprise that Italy has produced many great authors and historians. One of them is Guglielmo Ferrero.

Ferrero was born in Portici, near Naples, Italy, on July 31, 1871. He studied law in Pisa, Bologna, and Turin. He married Gina Lombroso, a daughter of Cesare Lombroso, the criminologist and psychiatrist with whom he wrote "The Female Offender."

From 1891 to1894, Ferrero traveled extensively in Europe. He later wrote "The Young Europe" (1897), a book which influenced the Irish author James Joyce (1882-1941).

After studying the history of Rome, Ferrero began writing political essays and novels (Between Two Worlds in 1913, Speeches to the Deaf in 1925, and The Two Truths in 1933-1939).

When Benito Mussolini and the Fascists gained control of Italy, they forced liberal intellectuals to leave the country. Because Ferrero refused to leave he was placed under house arrest. In 1929 Ferrero accepted a professorship at the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva.

Ferrero's writings were proscribed by the Italian Fascist government in 1935. His last works (Adventure, Bonaparte in Italy, The Reconstruction of Europe, The Principles of Power and The Two French Revolutions) were dedicated to the French Revolution and Napoleon.

Ferrero visited the United States. He gave lectures, which were collected and published in 1909 as "Characters and Events of Roman History." He was invited to the White House in 1908 by Theodore Roosevelt, who read Ferrero's "The Greatness and Decline of Rome."

The remainder of his life, Ferrero lived in exile. He died in 1942 at Mont Pèlerin, Switzerland.

Visalia, CA By Nick Natarnicola

I would like to make some comments about the sale of the Grand Lodge Building in San Francisco. I am a member of the Building Feasibility Committee. An appraisal by an MAI Appraiser, which banks and financial institutions use, appraised the property at \$5,000,000. If we use the tax liability of 40%, which Barbara Fumosa Wisniewski states in her November II Leone article, we would pay \$2,000,000 in taxes leaving the Grand Lodge Building Fund with 3,000,000. In the Central Valley of California, new office building cost about \$200 per square foot. We were told to find buildings of 6,000 square feet at \$200 a square foot comes to \$1,200,000, leaving us with \$1,800.000 in the bank and a new building that would ADA, Fire and Earthquake compliant. We would also have the income from the sale of the liquor license. As to the cost of upkeep and expenses of the new grand Lodge Building, we were told that 3,000 square feet was needed for the office, leaving 3,000 square feet to be rented. New office space in the valley rent for \$1.00 and up per square foot. This would generate \$36,000 per year in income. Property taxes on the new building would be \$12,000 per year, leaving \$24,000 for maintenance and utilities. The office expenses would be paid by the rent.

We cannot say where the Grand Lodge Building will be situated. It may take a year to sell the building and the Grand Lodge does not have the resources to buy a new building until the old one is sold. If we spent time to find a building, the possibility of the building still being available would be nil. If we do sell the building we could see if the new owner would allow us to rent until we find a suitable location. I urge you to look at all the facts and decide what is best for the Grand Lodge and not be swayed by all the propaganda being put us by the Brothers and Sisters opposed to selling the building. Earthquake Relief Fund




