



The clown is an important character in our culture. He has had a long and varied history going back to ancient times. His is a role dating back to primitive ceremonies. He represents the element of irrationality in man. He brings humor to a situation. One way or another, the clown reveals himself to be a stupid, incompetent fool. He is the archetype of comedy. He became a main character as comic theater developed from the ancient Greeks to the Romans. The Greeks usually masked the faces of performers.

With the collapse of the Roman Empire, organized theater almost vanished. During the Middle Ages, wandering minstrels and acrobats performed in the marketplace or on an open field. Troupes formed of acrobats, jugglers, conjurers, minstrels, and animal trainers. Also, dwarfs served to entertain nobility and commoners.

Italy was instrumental in revitalizing comic characters and public performances. From the 16th to the 18th century, Italy put on what has come to be called Commedia dell'Arte. Stock characters evolved, most wearing costumes and some wearing masks that covered the upper part of the face, leaving the jaw and mouth unmasked to facilitate speech.

The stock characters of the Commedia dell'Arte included the lecherous old merchant, the pompous doctor of law, the boastful army captain, and young lovers. Minor actors played roles such as tattered knights, singers, thieves, and "zanni" (servants). There were elements of miming, burlesque, situational comedy, and knockabout humor in the shows. There weren't scripts per se, and the players could change their lines and actions in response to the moods of

the audience. Sometimes the humor was coarse and vulgar.

Today, our clown is someone who wears a funny costume and does things to make people laugh. He paints his face, and he sometimes puts on a funny nose. There are three types of traditional clowns. The Auguste type is the one we usually think of when we think of a clown. He has a smiling face. He wears white makeup and a humorous nose. His costume is bizarre, and he wears enormous shoes. He is always falling or getting bumped. The Charlie type is always in trouble. He makes us laugh, and we feel sorry for him. Charlie Chaplan was one. And, thirdly, the Joey type is an acrobat or a juggler. In circuses Joey may be a horseman. He makes people laugh by bothering the other performers.

Clowns are a subject in literature and are portrayed in art. We see them in various media. They are used in children's literature and programs. Clown types prevalent in America are the hobo, the tramp, and the bum. Some clowns are depicted as evil as a form of dark humor, as the DC Comics character the Joker who opposes Batman. The Italian word for clown is "pagliaccio." Pagliacci (clowns) is an Italian opera by Ruggero Leoncavallo.

Italians have greatly appreciated and understood humor. The English actor of Italian ancestry, Joseph Grimaldi (1778-1837), is considered the first modern clown. He devised the whiteface make-up design. The term "Joey clown" derives from his name and career.

If you dream you are in the company of a clown, it may mean there is trouble ahead. Or it may mean you are being fooled. Or you should take things less seriously.

3) Italy is the only country in the world possessing two microstates enclaves: Vatican City and the Republic of San Marino.

4) Just 2km South of Venice, there is an Island called "Poveglia" which is forbidden to visit because Italians think it's haunted. Historically, until 1968 the island was used to isolate people suffering plagues and mental disorders.

5) Two of twenty Italian regions are islands: Sicily and Sardinia. In addition to those, Italy has over 80 inhabited islands with the most popular being Capri, Elba, and Ischia.

6) Italy has over 1500 lakes and most are concentrated in the Northern regions between the Alps.

7) Italy has more than 7,600 km of coastline and is famous for its picturesque sandy beaches facing the Tirrenean, the Mediterranean, the Adriatic, and the Ionian Sea.

8) The tallest mountain in the European Union is the Mont Blanc and its summit's ownership, reaching an elevation of 4808m above sea level) is shared by Italy and France, marking the frontier between the two countries.



Advice from the WHO

Attention All Presidents ...

Monthly Zoom Meeting 4th Sunday of the month



We gather together, go over what is going on in each of our lodges. This is the place to address the adventures our lodges are facing. Let's see how we can help each other.

Won't you join us?

The World Health Organization (WHO) website has instructive videos showing how to wear a mask. They advise cleaning hands both before putting the mask on and after taking it off, not touching the mask, making sure it fits properly without gaps, and removing it by the ear loops while leaning forward and avoiding any contact with the front of the mask. They cover proper storage and cleaning of re-usable masks, and they remind viewers that the mask alone will not guarantee protection, and people must still follow social distancing and handwashing recommendations. They explain that prolonged use of masks does not cause CO2 intoxication or oxygen deficiency. This has been tested; despite the fears of some in the public, blood oxygen and CO2 levels are not affected by wearing masks. Masks should not be worn while exercising, because sweating can make the mask wet, which can interfere with breathing and promote the growth of microorganisms.
