
Now that the holidays are over it is time to settle back to our everyday lives but first we wish you all a "Happy, Healthy New Year". The Christmas tree lighting was beautiful, if you missed it you can watch it on the Museum website. We would like to introduce you to Anonio Meucci, the candle maker and inventor. He was born in Florence in April 1808. He studied Design and engineering at the Academy of Fine Arts and married Ester Mochi 1835 at which time they migrated to Cuba where they worked at the Tacon Opera House. He was employed as superintendent of mechanics and Ester, a seamstress, was appointed wardrobe mistress.

Meucci was fascinated by electricity and it was in Cuba that he developed an electroplating workshop and experimented with shock therapy as a way to treat headaches. During one of these treatments, Meucci heard a patient's cry transmitted through copper wire he was using by electricity. Shock therapy was the first of many experiments that lead him to the "speaking telegraph" in 1849. Alexander Graham Bell was only 2 years old and living in Edinburgh, Scotland when Meucci first began his experiments with sound. A fire in the Tacon Opera House in 1850 forced the company to seek work in New York City. Antonio and Ester left Cuba and settled on Staten Island in 1850. Wow! That's a lot of info for this month, look forward to the next episode next month.


