# Chickens by Stephen Contrado, B.A., Th.M 165 Nantasket Ave. # 9 Hull, MA 02045

Chickens are a domesticated animal classified under the headings "fowl" and "poultry." They are raised primarily for their meat and eggs, but their feathers have also been used in industries and crafts. They are the chief kind of poultry, consumed more than geese, ducks, and turkeys. Chickens are raised in barnyards and large chicken farms. They have been raised for thousands of years. Several decades ago millions of families kept a few chickens in their backyards, but the practice has died out because large scale chicken farming has become so efficient, and people can buy poultry and eggs at supermarkets. Small farms often keep a flock of chickens.

Breeds of fowl have been developed to produce the tenderest meat or the largest eggs. Chickens are fed specialized feeds of grains usually mixed with antibiotics to prevent disease. There are different mixtures of feed for the young fowl, "chicks," and for older fowl. Traditionally, chicken, "hens," were kept in "chicken houses" to lay eggs. Today, eggs are hatched in incubators. There are also special hatcheries to supply farmers with chickens. Chickens are graded to their age and weight. A broiler is six to eight weeks old and weights up to two and a half pounds. A frier is nine to ten weeks old and weighs two and a half to four pounds. A spring chicken is about four months old and weighs up to four pounds. Heavier and older chickens are called roasters or simply fowl.

Chicken eggs are an important industry and food. Refrigerated eggs can be kept for a long time without going bad. Many people eat eggs with toast and bacon or ham for breakfast. Eggs are also prepared as an omelet -called "frittata" in Italian. Eggs are an ingredient for baking. Hard-boiled eggs are much loved and have symbolic significance while playing a role in various religious and social customs.

Chickens are amazing animals. Various breeds are different colors and sizes. The male is especially significant. Cocks were important in many ancient rituals. White cocks were sacred to the goddess Demeter. The Romans sacrificed cocks to the Lares and kept them in the temple of Hercules. Using cocks to fight one another has been a sport for thousands of years (illegal today in most countries). The Celts sacrificed the cock to the goddess Brigit.

The cock or rooster crows at the break of dawn. It is associated with vigilance. According to folklore, when the cock crows evil spirits return to the underworld and ghosts depart. People believed cocks could forecast weather. The cock has been used to represent war and aggression. Roosters are a theme in folk art. Weather vanes sometimes feature a wooden or metal cock. If you dream of a cock crowing, beware of false friends. The Chinese assign a year to the rooster in the zodiac. Our expression "cocky" derives from the strutting behavior of the rooster. To call someone "chicken" means he is afraid. How about cooking a nice chicken cacciatore?
