

Thanksgiving is an important American holiday, always celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November, with a large meal centering on turkey as the main course, or secondo piatto. This major holiday does not really exist in Italy, except perhaps in the homes of American expats. American visitors in Italy hoping to find a traditional holiday meal might get lucky and locate a restaurant which serves a Thanksgiving meal.

Today, traditionally, this celebration involves a huge meal shared at home with family and friends. Turkey is the main course, along with stuffing, vegetables, potatoes and gravy, cranberry sauce, bread, and pies, almost always pumpkin. Many Italian-American families, however, celebrate this day with the traditional turkey dinner, while also adding some recipes from their Italian ancestors. My own family maintained the American traditions without any added pasta dishes or Italian touches. But I spoke with many who shared their families' Thanksgiving day traditions with a special Italian touch.

Italian-American traditions at Thanksgiving can vary. For some with Sicilian roots, a chestnut dressing and roasted chestnuts are often served. Antipasto with mixed nuts and fennel, roasted artichokes, with red pepper stuffing, and fresh cheeses, like ricotta, mozzarella, and parmesans are popular with many Italian-Americans on Thanksgiving.

For some, home-made pasta, either ravioli or spaghetti, with home-made

sauce, or gravy, as some call it, is also an important part of the meal. Joe LaPanna says that "being a 'food' person, Thanksgiving is my all time favorite holiday." He remembers that one grandmother would bring Italian cookies and/or cannoli from New York, and the "other grandmother would make homemade zepolli, and bow ties." Joe honors his mother by maintaining some Italian traditions today. "I slip prosciutto into a dish here and there, make polenta instead of cornbread and always serve an Italian wine or two."

Alfredo Vinci, An Italian-American originally from Siracusa, Sicily, recalls a "turkey stuffed with sausage and chestnuts." The meal would also include "lasagna and torta di ricotta". Alfredo considers Thanksgiving his favorite holiday, but always looks forward to the lasagna.

Expat Rick Zullo recalls one Thanksgiving in Rome when his uncle, a member of the Christian Brothers, visited at Thanksgiving time. "The house that his order owns is not far from the Vatican and the cook was putting on a special meal for the American brothers, so they invited us to join them. The cook was Italian, and I must say that he did a good job with the turkey. But he still couldn't resist serving a typical Italian antipasto (sliced meats and cheeses), as well as two pasta dishes. He made a pumpkin pie, too, but something was "off" about it. I ended up having some biscotti with sweet wine for dessert."

Dr. J.B. Zito's Thanksgivings always involved serving a lot of food to a lot of people. His family served food to anyone; they volunteered at the Kiwanis and Elks clubs to serve food for free. At their home, from early morning till late at night, they were serving food. Big trays of lasagna and Italian wine were a must but Jack stresses, "there are two parts to Thanks giving. There is the Thanks and then there is the Giving."

Using her wonderful cooking talents which she inherited from her mother, HazelAnn worked as a cook supervisor for 10 years at Hanford Convalescent and Rehab Center. She continued to utilize her culinary expertise every Thursday having her entire family over for dinner. Besides being a fantastic cook, HazelAnn drove a bus for the Kings Area Rural Transit (KART) for 26 years, retiring in May 2017. One of her favorite duties at this job was picking up senior citizens at their doors and taking them to doctor appointments and shopping. She was featured in the Hanford Sentinel as the "Smile Behind the Wheel".

Family was very important to HazelAnn. described them as the "apple of her eye". "Nana" always loved spending time with her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. also enjoyed reading and gardening (she was a member of the LaCasa Garden Club) and traveling. Her travels included Hawaii, Canada, Mexico, New York and Italy. HazelAnn commented: "When we traveled to New York, it was a very emotional experience. It was very moving to watch the same glimpse of the Statue of Liberty that my grandparents say upon arriving in America, and even possibly sitting on the same benches her grandparents did in the Registration Hall at Ellis Island."

She loved the vouth in particular and used the motto when she was President of the State Youth Committee - "our youth are the future of our Order." Farewell Sister HazelAnn. You will be forever in our hearts.

HazelAnn is survived by her loving husband George Christin. Her children: Ronald Christin, Deborah (Kyle) Popoy, Suzann (Jamie) Counter, Paul (Joanne) Christin and MaryAnn Christin and her nine grandchildren and seventeen great-grandchildren with one on the way. The next night was our annual Italian Heritage Banquet and Ball, which was held on the 32nd floor of the celebrated St. Francis Hotel. Christopher Columbus, portrayed by Joseph Cervetto, Jr, was knighted by Queen Isabella Gina Marie Guglielmoni, whose court included her Princess, Duchesses, Contessas, Ladies, Maiden, Crown Bearer and Scroll Bearer, all in period costumes. 

Italian Wedding Soup originated as a vegetable soup recipe from Toledo, Spain. Naples, Italy, was under control of the Borbon crown, of Spanish royalty. The Spaniards occupied the area to create a presence and exert control. In the 1880s, Italians from the area immigrated to the USA and took the recipe with them, but the "marriage" part of the name became confused with the idea of "wedding"; the ingredients evolved to use what was on hand. The meat component became meatballs, and because the soup was associated with the Italian population on the USA East Coast, it became known as Italian Wedding Soup.





A. Bartlett Giamatti

Angelo Bartlett Giamatti was the seventh commissioner of Major League Baseball. He was born in Boston on September 4, 1938 and grew up in South Hadley, Massachusetts. His paternal grandparents Angelo and Maria were Italian immigrants who came to the United Stated around 1900. His maternal grandfather was Bartlett Walton, who graduated from Phillips Academy Andover and Harvard College. Giamatti's parents were

well educated. His mother Mary Claybaugh Walton was a Smith College graduate of the class of 1935. His father Valentine John Giamatti was a professor, chairman of Department of Italian Language and Literature at Mount Holyoke College.

Giamatti attended South

Hadley High School and spent his junior year at the American Overseas School at Rome. He graduated from Phillips Academy in 1956. He graduated with a B.A. in English from Yale magna cum laude in 1960 and a Ph.D. in comparative literature in 1964. In 1960 he married Toni Marilyn Smith. The couple had three children, actors Paul and Marcus and jewelry designer Elena.

Giamatti taught Italian

Giamatti taught Italian and comparative literature at Princeton and Yale. Giamatti served as president of Yale University from 1978 to 1986, the youngest president of the university in its history. He was elected a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 1980.

Giamatti was president

of National League of professional baseball from 1986 to 1989. On April 1, 1989 he became the 7th Commissioner of Baseball. While on vacation on Martha's Vineyard he died suddenly of a heart attack on September 1, 1989 at the age of 51. He had been a heavy smoker for many years.

Giamatti was induct-

ed into the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame in 1992. He was one of baseball's most articulate fans. He regarded community, self-improvement, passion, civility, cheerfulness, integrity, grace, and teamwork as the essential values of baseball and life. He believed the game of baseball ideally fit the traits of the American character and reflected nature's cyclical motion.

Giamatti's writings on

Giamatti's writings on baseball capture the spirit of the game. An invitation to address the Massachusetts Historical Society in 1985 resulted in the scholarly essay "Baseball and the American Character" published in Harper's Magazine (October 1986). In the essay Giamatti says, "For the immigrant, the game was a club to belong to, another fraternal organization, a common language in a strange land. For so much of expanding and expansive America, the game was a free institution with something for everyone."



In 1904, I founded in San Francisco, the Bank of Italy now know as the Bank of America,

the largest financial institution in the world. I am A. P. Giannini.

I am Enrico Fermi, father of nuclear science in America.

First enlisted man to win the medal of Honor in World War II,

I am John Basilone of New Jersey.

I am an Italian-American. I am the million strong who served in America's armies and the tens of thousands whose names are enshrined in military cemeteries

from Guadalcanal to the Rhine.

I am the steel maker in Pittsburgh, the grower in the Imperial Valley of California, the textile designer in Manhattan, the movie maker in Hollywood, the home maker and the breadwinner in 10,000 communities.
