Thank you is not enough to truly express my deep gratitude for all the work and devotion all of you have given to the Grand Lodge. You all exemplify the heart and soul of an Italian family and our Order. It is that positive fraternal spirit that will keep our lodges and the Grand Lodge alive and growing. Bill & I will continue to visit lodges and attend meeting and events in 2016 - our commitment to you as your State President and 1st Gent.

Italy has passed through every important historical phase of development. Each phase has left its imprint on the people and the landscape. Feudalism became the chief political system after the fall of the Roman Empire. Some of the Empire's traditions survived the barbarian invasions which ended classical civilization. For example, Christianity continued to flourish, and Latin remained the literary language of Europe.

After the barbarian tribes conquered Rome, law and order broke down. No single power was strong enough to unite large countries and rule as Rome had done. People were insecure because they never knew when tribes or foreign armies would overrun their farms, steal their property, crops and animals, and perhaps kill their families.

A system of land ownership arose. Landlords took the lands belonging to farmers in return for protection and made them a kind of slave called a "serf." Landlords hired bodyguards that served as small armies. They rewarded these bodyguards by giving them a part of the land with the serfs on it. The bodyguards became knights, or vassals of the lord, and a class of nobles arose. Landlords also hired mercenary soldiers. They taxed the people to support themselves and wage wars.

At this time the Roman Catholic Church was the only religious institution in western Europe. It kept the Latin language as a means of communication and a way of preserving general knowledge. Many of the lords gave the clergy a part of their land. Some of the clergy

became feudal lords themselves and fought as soldiers. The clergy built monasteries. Some individuals became monks and nuns. There was no printing press. Monks spent their time copying books and manuscripts. Priests helped make life easier for the people. They sought to prevent fighting on the Lord's Day and on holy days. Missionaries traveled about to win new converts to the faith.

On Sundays sometimes there were festivals and games in villages, but other days life was hard. Serfs worked all day in the fields. The lord got the largest share of crops grown, and the church would get a "tithe" (a tenth) of it. Only boys from noble families could become knights. Tournaments, or mock battles, such as jousting, were held on castle grounds. Nobles on horseback with packs of hounds hunted wild boars and deer. Nobles trained hawks and falcons to catch birds and small animals. Ladies worked on fine embroidery, and they sometimes played musical instruments.

Serfs lived in hovels with dirt floors. Pigs and other animals sometimes lived with the serfs in the same hovel. The poor had little more to eat than a simple meal or bread. Mostly pork or fish was consumed during better times. Serfs rarely saw more of the world than their own villages. In times of danger, they sought protection in the castles. They were forced to serve in the Lord's army during times of war. Peddlers visited the castles. They sold cloth, spices, perfumes and other rare commodities.

Justice under feudalism was often primitive. An argument could be settled by having two men fight. The winner was judged to be in the right. Every man had a definite place. If a man was a farmer, his son would become a farmer. A man often needed permission to marry from the lord. In the cellar of the castle there were dungeons where the lord could keep his enemies chained to walls.

An end to feudalism came about slowly. Cottage industries grew up, and trade between countries allowed people to earn money with which they bought their freedom from the lords. Towns arose and serfs escaped and sought employment in them. Some became shopkeepers. Kings conquered the feudal lords and set up central governments with armies and police forces.

Craftsmen who made the same commodities joined unions called guilds. If they were good at their work, they could become journeymen, eventually masters. The guilds made certain that goods were well-made and wages and prices were fair. Our English word "masterpiece" derives from the work of those craftsmen. The guild system helped create a middle class.

Feudalism lasted for about 1,000 years in Europe. It was a harsh political and economic system. Today, to say a political system is "feudal" is saying it is undeveloped and backward. Italy has some interesting castles and ruins dating back hundreds of years. Some of Italy's oldest customs stem from feudal institutions.


Have you purchased your "365" tickets yet for 2016. How about asking your lodge to buy 2 or 3 tickets, you might be surprised as to how many times you could win.






