

Eulogy of Vince La Banca The Brother, The Son The Uncle

I would like to start by thanking all of you and to extend my sincere appreciation on behalf of Vince, my sister and my parents, for all the support, prayers and love you extended over the past couple of months. Vince was very aware of all the well wishes and it really made a difference.

It is an honor and privilege for me to pay tribute to a very special person, my brother Vince La Banca. As I began to reach out for the right words to express my thoughts about my brother Vince, I remembered the many valued and meaningful roles that he played throughout his life.

THE BROTHER

He was always protective as a big brother I recall as a young teenager just starting high school, I was a freshman and Vince was a senior, we got on the topic of discussing drug use in school and at parties. I remember as if it was yesterday we were talking then Vince stopped for a moment and moved close to me with the most serious of eyes and said; "I better not ever see you get mixed up with that stuff, it will screw up your life!!!" He put the fear in me that day, and I can say without any doubt that his words stuck with me for the rest of my life. He was being protective...

THE SON

As for my parents, Vince was their first child and son!! What a special title to be first. He looked after our parents, running business errands, making business calls, calling and checking when they would be home, asking what they wanted for dinner, and what the plans were for the next birthday event. He was happy to help them as long as he complained enough about it.

THE UNCLE

I feel that this was Vince's greatest gift... the unconditional love he had for his nieces and nephews; Mark Jr., Gianna, Enzo and Alisia, they were everything to him!!

When they went to the house, he spent time talking and engaging with them. He always made sure Enzo had his favorite cars to play with. He always quizzed Mark and Gianna on various trivia and played their favorite "Restaurant". He would be the difficult customer, Gianna was Molly the waitress, Alisia was the bus boy, Mark Jr. was the chef. It was always an interesting dining experience.

The highlight of gifts, were lotto tickets, the kids would fight over them all the time.

Vince would go to every sporting event the kids were involved in; soccer, baseball, softball... you name it, he was there. It wasn't uncommon for him to go online and download the kid's game schedule before we did. He would go out and buy equipment for whatever sport they were playing and was always available to help drive them to the game and back. Vince would video tape countless hours of the kids' games and would recount the play-by-play action and show you a video clip to prove it. I was always amazed at the relationship and love he had for the kids... it made me so proud and happy!!!

His laughter with the kids was authentic and vulnerable, laughing from deep inside and sharing a bond with them as he did with no other.

THE CHEF

Vince loved to cook and eat!! I must say he was a pretty good chef, but boy did he leave a trail of dirty pots and pans..... Regardless of how easy or complex the recipe was, he would use every single pot and pan available and leave the kitchen looking like a disaster zone...but the food was good, which makes it a wash.

He was always cooking for others, he never said much to us about this, but during the holidays he would prepare food in small portions, package them up and leave to deliver them. It wasn't entirely clear who he brought the food to, but it was evident to me that they were individuals that might not be able to prepare a holiday meal.

Vince, brother, it is very hard to say goodbye so we will just say so long.



Of the days when you were here.*



Fish is a staple food of many countries. People have fished since ancient times. Those peoples living by the ocean or the sea set out on these bodies of water to fish, while people living inland fished in rivers, lakes, and streams. The first methods of fishing relied upon spears, wicker baskets, and traps. Soon ropes were made to construct large nets to capture large batches of fish, and men made various sizes of fishing boats.

Because of storms, fishing can be a dangerous occupation. And sometimes fish aren't plentiful. Fishermen often prayed for divine intervention, and there is an abundance of folklore associated with fishing. After large-scale industry satisfied the needs of nations, many people adopted fishing as a sport. Today, commercial fishing plays an important role in the economy, and thousands of people enjoy fishing with rods as a recreation and as part of the tourist industry. There are books and magazines to advise us how to become expert anglers.

Being a peninsula, Italy began fishing early in its development as a nation. The ancient Romans fished the Mediterranean Sea. Italians caught many varieties of fish, as well as octopus, squid, and shrimp. Fish can be dried and salted and stored for months. Modern methods of canning now allow fish to be stored. Fish markets and fish stores played an important role in many Italian-American communities.

The California tuna fleets brought in hundreds of thousands of pounds of tuna every year. Fish are being caught in very large numbers today, and some species are in danger of extinction. The government makes laws and sets limits on fishing. A license to fish is usually necessary. To help keep the waters stocked with fish, some governments operate fish hatcheries.

The seacoasts of both Italy and the United States have many cities and towns with busy wharves and marinas. Some Italians who worked on boats and docks in Italy were able to work in the same occupation when they immigrated to the United States.






