As you know, St Josephs' day, March 19 is a special day in Italy. Giuseppe is one of the most popular names in southern Italy, and Mary's husband is celebrated on this date, as Festa del Papa, or Father's Day. Giuseppe, which translates to Joseph in English, is the saint of children, unwed mothers, and the needy.

The celebration originated in the Middle Ages during a horrible drought. People of Sicily prayed to San Giuseppe to help them with rain, and the rains came. The fava bean was the most plentiful crop and is now a symbol of good luck and generosity. To show their appreciation for San Giuseppe's help, Sicilians set out tables filled with food and invited anyone who wanted to, to enjoy the feast. The day is now known as one of helping those in need and offering food to the poor. Zeppole is one of the most traditional pastries prepared on this special day. Both the Catholic and Lutheran churches celebrate the day. Celebrations include fava beans, wearing red clothing and erecting altars, filled with bread, and usually a grand parade where they carry the statue of Saint Joseph through the town. born they used to pin money for the poor on the ribbons hanging from the statue.

From a religious aspect, March 19, which is always during Lent, is a day of abstinence. This explains the custom of Saint Joseph tables being covered with meatless dishes.

In Sicily, it takes many women, who work for days to prepare the ornamental bread. Many are braided into shapes of a cross or crown, staffs, and palms, each rep-Joseph, resenting Jesus, and Mary respectively. The breads are then placed on a three-tiered altar, representing the Trinity, and covered with beautiful linens. The altar table is blessed by a priest, and after the celebration, children take the altar down, and the food goes to the needy. People also place other items on the altars, including flowers, limes, candles, wine, fava beans, especially prepared cakes, bread, and cookies (as well as other meatless dishes), and of course, zeppole. You may also see breadcrumbs on many altars, representing sawdust from Joseph, the carpenter.

Reports were given by President Nancy and the 5 Vice Presidents keeping us up to date as what is happening at the National level. Kudos were extended many times by all as to the competency and commitment of the Office Staff.

The Membership Committee has been busily working with the Technology Committee reaching out to increase membership. While our membership num-bers have dropped some, they have seen a big increase in the Members-At-Large level. National has extended the waiving of the \$8.00 national new mem-ber fee until August 2021. 
Hanford Lodge has not had a regular meeting since

### Earthquakes

Earthquakes occur frequently in Italy. They have for centuries. Many have been disastrous. The Italian peninsula is on a volcanic base. Two famous volcanoes are here, Vesuvius in southern Italy and Etna in Sicily. Underground volcanic activity creates great pressure and moves the rock layers, causing the land surface to shake violently. The shifting ground topples buildings not designed to withstand the turbulence and streets split open. Making matters worse, fires break out and terrible sounds cause panic. Sometimes many lives are lost. And sometimes many lives are miraculously spared.

Messina and Reggio Calabria, Italy, had a severe earthquake in 1908, which killed 120,000. In former times the news of earthquakes traveled slowly. People away from towns struck by earthquakes desperately sought word regarding their loved ones. Newspapers and telegraphs sometimes carried varying accounts of the lives lost and the damage done. The people of the United States experienced the San Francisco earthquake in 1906. There were hundreds of lives lost and thousands of dollars in property damage. Fires burned for three days without stopping.

Our ability to anticipate and cope with earthquakes has progressed. The modern seismometer is an instrument that can record earthquakes thousands of miles away. We are making buildings stronger and safer than ever before. And we can get necessary aid and relief to victims iThe Italian word for earthquake is "terremoto."





#### Good Friday and Easter Week Processions in Italy

Solemn religious processions are held in Italian cities and towns on the Friday or Saturday before Easter and sometimes on the Sunday holiday. Many churches have special statues of the Virgin Mary and Jesus that may be paraded through the city or displayed in the main square (piazza).

Participants are often dressed in traditional ancient costumes, and olive branches are frequently used along with palm fronds in the processions and to decorate churches.

Sicily has elaborate and dramatic processions. Enna holds a large event on Good Friday, with about 2,000 friars dressed in ancient costumes walking through the streets of the city. Trapani is another interesting place to see processions, held for several days during Holy Week. The Good Friday procession there, Misteri di Trapani, lasts 24 hours.


What's believed to be the oldest Good Friday procession in Italy is in Chieti in the Abruzzo region; it's very moving with Secchi's "Miserere" played by 100 violins.

Some towns, such as Montefalco and Gualdo Tadino in Umbria, hold live passion plays during the night of Good Friday. Others put on plays acting out the stations of the Cross. Beautiful torchlight processions are held in Umbria in hill towns such as Orvieto and Assisi.
