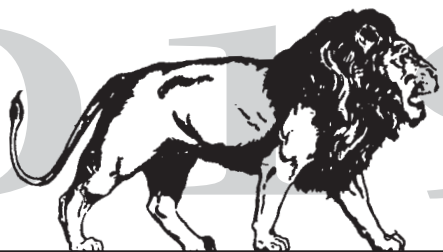

Thank you for all you do to keep our Order strong.

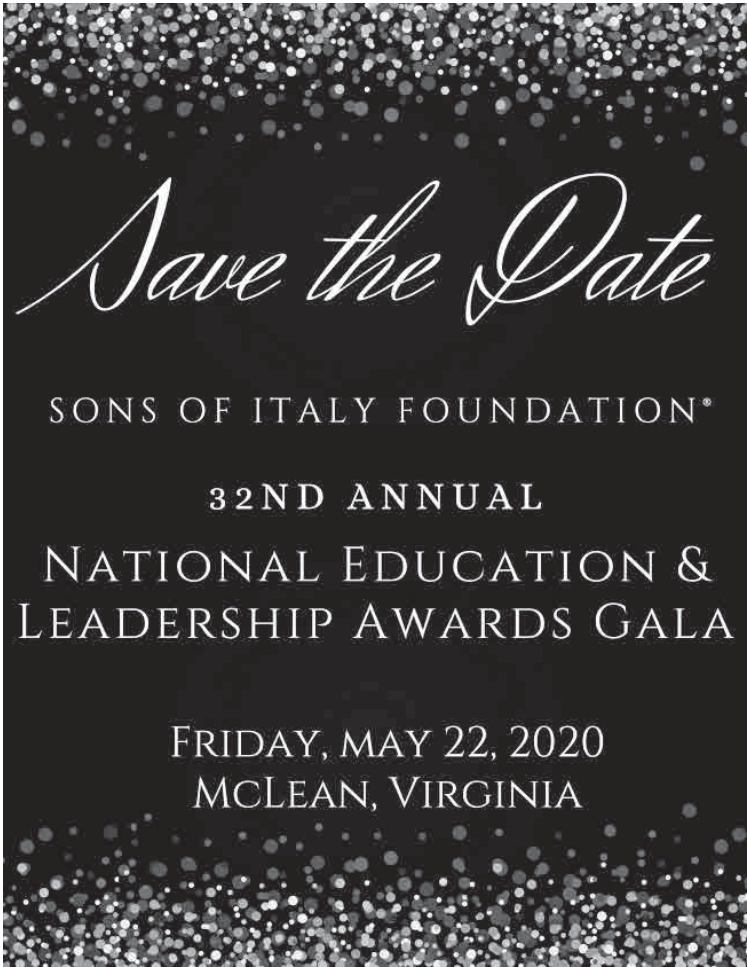

# The United States Bill of Rights

Italian-Americans have been among the most law-abiding citizens of the United States. Italians came to this country legally and demonstrated pride in learning the English language and gaining American citizenship. They worked hard, and they didn't become dependent on taxpayers and on the government for welfare benefits. Italian Americans believed in and supported both public and private education and encouraged their children to attend schools and universities.

Certain advantaged and powerful elite groups felt threaten by and jealous of these hardworking and ambitious newcomers. Elite groups sought unjust ways to repress and exploit the newcomers. They used various tactics to demonize and exclude Italians. But all efforts to repress and destroy Italian Americans have failed due in large part to the fact that this country is a nation of laws, not of privileged individuals.

Indeed, the Italian Americans had certain impartial and powerful laws on their side, which protected and continue to protect legal rights. The first ten amendments of the United States Constitution are known as the Bill of Rights. They promulgate rights and due process in trying criminal and civil cases. The amendments prohibit high-handed and arbitrary actions as un-Con-

stitutional. These laws have advanced democracy and justice for generations of legal immigrants.

When a violation of a Constitutional right or due process occurs in a lower court, the verdict or judgment may be appealed up to the Supreme Court of the United States. This country has an independent judicial system that has the power to limit Congress and the President if they exceed their Constitutional authority. Americans have liberties or rights that cannot be denied to them.

It is essential for all Americans to understand the United States Constitution and the courts. There are courts to serve every American in every state, county, or city. Some of these are state courts others are federal. They have general or specific jurisdictions. The courts hear unique cases and use precedent to make rulings, but judges also have discretionary authority to see that justice is done.

The study of the law is a noble endeavor. Many people make their living in assisting others to file complaints or claims. There are various branches of law, such as criminal law, business law, administrative law, family law, intellectual property law, labor law, maritime law, and international law. A good knowledge of law will greatly increase a person's confidence and ability to negotiate.

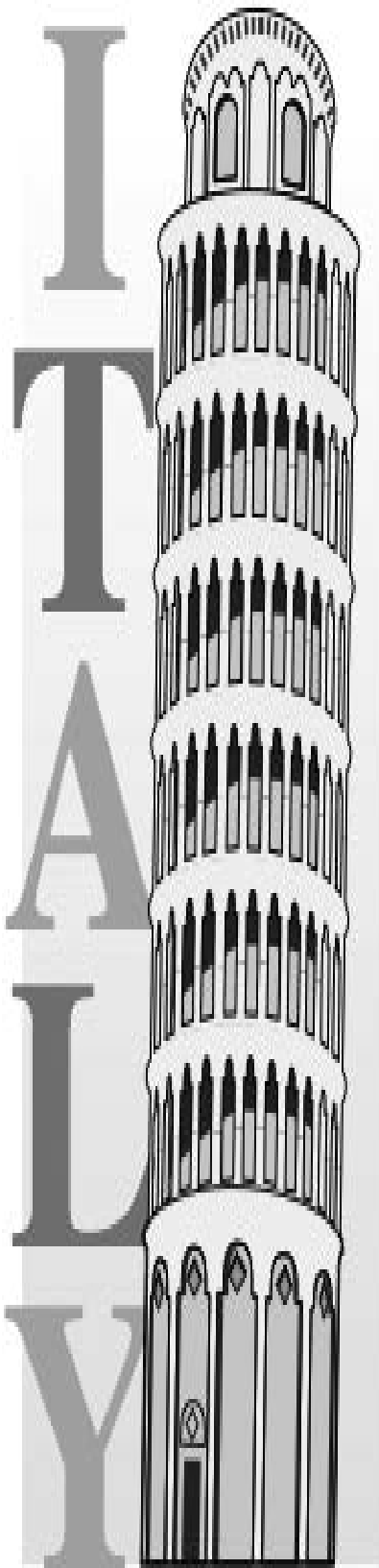
