Columbus Day has played a major role in building that heritage and needs to be protected. It is not in quiet assimilation that we become stronger but only in noisy celebration of our past, our heritage, and our national celebration of the Columbus Day holiday.



Even then there was no insult meant by the name.

On October 13, 1943, Italy declared war on its former Axis partner Germany after the downfall of Mussolini and the collapse of his Fascist government.

The Chicago-area Italian-American community was dealt a devastating series of blows in the waning days of July. It's impossible to express the damage done to our collective psyche when Chicago's three Columbus statues were plucked by the city from their pedestals in the wee hours of the morning and whisked off to storage.

According to Mayor Lightfoot, the moves were made in the interest of public safety and are only temporary, but a profound sense of betrayal and loss remains. The question is, how do we most effectively respond? As Fra Noi goes to press, the Joint Civic Committee of Italian Americans is convening at the Old Neighborhood Italian American Club to craft a strategy, the details of which will be published in the October issue. In the meantime, bold action is already afoot on the national level.

After 40 years of controlling the narrative, Columbus bashers are finally in for a major pushback. According to their version of history, Columbus was a genocidal fiend who slaughtered thousands, enslaved hundreds and abused native workers. This illusion has been conjured through an alchemy of outright lies and artful manipulation of historical documents.

In reality, Columbus admired the peaceful tribe he first encountered; never killed or ordered the death of a native without provocation; sent prisoners of war — not slaves —to Spain after countering an attack by a warlike tribe; and did his best to halt the abuse of native workers once he discovered it.

Europe's encounter with native populations would have played out quite differently if Columbus and his like had

been at the helm throughout and their men had actually listened to them. His opponents, however, have chosen to demonize him, lumping him together with the worst of the colonizers who arrived in his wake.

They've spoon fed their noxious brew to educators, elected officials and journalists, too many of whom have swallowed it whole with nary a fact check and spread the misinformation to

the general public. As a result, Columbus is on the verge of being relegated to the trash heap of history. Also being swept away are his monumental accomplishments as an explorer and his pivotal role in uplifting our community during our darkest hour.

Until recently, we've sat back and blithely assumed that the truth would prevail, but the rising tide of anti-Columbus sentiment has shaken us from our complacency.

The Italian American One Voice Committee was the first into the breach on the national level. For several years now, this tireless advocacy group has staged press conferences, mounted email campaigns, and appeared before city councils in response to efforts across the country to eliminate Columbus Day and remove statues in his honor. And just last month, five of the nation's largest Italian-American organiza-

tions pooled their resources and joined the fray.

The Columbus Citizens Foundation (CCF), Italians Sons and Daughters of America, National Italian American Foundation (NIAF), Order of the Sons and Daughters of Italy, and UNICO National have banded together in an unprecedented show of unity to fund the National Columbus Education Foundation.

"As the community most closely associated with Columbus and Columbus Day, we felt it was our civic duty to present and defend the other side of the story," foundation President Angelo Vivolo says. "We have to ask ourselves why the majority of the sources are being ignored and repressed while one of the oldest American holidays and first American heroes is summarily wiped away without any objective conversation."

The groups have already run an ad in the Washington Times calling on Congress and President Trump to reaffirm their commitment to Columbus Day and honor the great explorer's importance to our community. They've also created a website — KnowColumbus.org — that will soon be brimming with the facts needed to launch a broad-based informational counteroffensive.

They're facing an uphill battle of herculean proportions. But given how much our community has overcome in our fraught history, my money is on us.



Frank Capra

Frank Capra was born on May 18, 1897 in a village near Palermo, Sicily. As a boy, he immigrated with his family to the United States. Capra remembered throughout his life the wonderful impression the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor made upon his young mind.

From the age of five or six, Capra was raised in Los Angeles, California. His father was a fruit-picker, and the young Capra sold newspapers after school for ten years. Graduating from high school, he worked playing banjo at nightclubs and taking odd jobs to pay his tuition at the California Institute of Technology.

After graduating from college, Capra was commissioned in the United States Army as a second lieutenant, having completed campus ROTC. He became a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1920. Film historians have said his ragsto-riches story personifies the American Dream.

Capra's first lucky break came in 1921 when he met actor Walter Montague whom he convinced to allow him to direct a film. Capra's first film was based on a Kipling story, Fultah Fisher's Boardinghouse, for which he received seventy-five dollars. In 1922 Capra worked at San Francisco's Paul Gerson studios where he learned many filmmaking techniques. Then he worked as a writer for Hal Roach's silent comedies.

...

In 1927 Capra made his first full-length feature, For Love O' Mike. He was hired

by Columbia Pictures and began directing films. He directed Platinum Blonde, which introduced the world to actress Jean Harlow. Capra earned his first Academy Award for directing with his 1934 classic It Happened One Night, starring Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert. Mr. Deeds Goes to Town (1936) won him a second Oscar. You Can't Take It With You (1938) brought him a third Oscar.

Within four days after the Japanese Attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, Capra quit his successful directing career in Hollywood and received a commission as a major in the United States Army.

Capra was married to Lucille Rayburn Warner in 1932 and they had four children. His films touched the hearts of America's filmgoers. His 1947 film, It's a Wonderful Life, starring James Stewart, is today a popular Christmas fantasy drama. Writer Allen Rivkin noted: "Capra's message - the necessity of man to respect his soul, to know that all men no matter how small, if they believe in themselves, are the greatest force in the world – comes through in his pictures... To the audiences who are the people in his pictures, Capra each time restores a faith in human nature."

Capra's last film was Pocketful of Miracles (1961), starring Bette Davis. Capra died in La Quinta, California, on September 3, 1991, at the age of ninety-four.



Advice from the WHO

The World Health Organization (WHO) website has instructive videos showing how to wear a mask. They advise cleaning hands both before putting the mask on and after taking it off, not touching the mask, making sure it fits properly without gaps, and removing it by the ear loops while leaning forward and avoiding any contact with the front of the mask. They cover proper storage and cleaning of re-usable masks, and they remind viewers that the mask alone will not guarantee protection, and people must still follow social distancing and handwashing recommendations. They explain that prolonged use of masks does not cause CO2 intoxication or oxygen deficiency. This has been tested; despite the fears of some in the public, blood oxygen and CO2 levels are not affected by wearing masks. Masks should not be worn while exercising, because sweating can make the mask wet, which can interfere with breathing and promote the growth of microorganisms.



News from Roma Lodge #1573 Tulare, CA by Larry Dutto

Currently there are 47 of 58 counties in California that have qualified for limited reopening of non-essential businesses such as restaurants, barbershops, salons, bars and theaters as long as masks and social distancing are practiced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Roma Lodge is in the center of Tulare County which is one of the remaining counties which is still on lockdown.

Since the pandemic hit Tulare County in March, 15,270 people have been sickened and 253 people have died from COVID-19 complications, according to the health agency. In a promising sign, the county's COVID-19 positivity rate is now 8.7%, slightly above the state's recommended 8%.

Roma Lodge meets at the International Agri-Center social hall each month and now that facility is being used as a COVID testing facility. Since March, the lodge has had to cancel monthly meetings, 90th Anniversary Celebration, annual ravioli dinner fundraiser and junior member night. We just learned the World Ag Expo, where the lodge has had an Italian sausage food booth since it started over 50 years ago, has been canceled for February of 2021.

As local lodge presidents we are continually faced with the decision as to whether to resume lodge activities or not. We can all agree the three tenets of the Order are Liberty-Equality-Fraternity of which we all rely on fraternity in getting our membership together to carryon the Italian Culture. Several lodges have resorted to virtual meetings, drive-through fundraisers, raffles, social distance picnics and other activities to keep lodge members informed and active.

Fortunately, Roma Lodge can endure in the short-term without the ability to hold fundraisers and will resume lodge meetings and other activities when Tulare County is off the governors watch list.
